Coachella Valley Public Cemetery District Trustee Marcos Coronel Jr. Appointed to Second Term

(Coachella, CA): The Coachella Valley Public Cemetery District (CVPCD) is welcoming back Marcos Coronel Jr. for a second term on the Board of Trustees. Coronel has served on the Cemetery District Board since July of 2017. His new term is effective immediately and will run through 2026.

Coronel expressed gratitude for the opportunity to continue his service to the community. “Grateful for the continual support from the Board of Trustees, Board of Supervisors and Staff; particularly Chairman Ernesto Rosales and Supervisor Perez,” says Coronel. “Our District continues to work toward reforming its practices to remain true to our mission to serve the needs of our constituents.”

About The Coachella Valley Public Cemetery District:

The Coachella Valley Public Cemetery District was formed August 8, 1927, as an independent special district, serving the public cemetery needs of the residents of Riverside County; our boundaries include the unincorporated areas of Mecca, Oasis, Bermuda Dunes, Thermal, Vista Santa Rosa, North Shore, Chiriaco Summit, Indio Hills, Desert Center and the cities of Coachella, Indio, La Quinta, Indian Wells, Palm Desert, and parts of Rancho Mirage, and is over 700 square miles larger than all other cemetery districts combined in Riverside County. The district has performed over 21,000 interments/burials and has set over 14,000 headstones/grave markers. The total district property consists of sixty acres, twenty-nine of the sixty have been developed for interment purposes.
